The literary representations that Nord examines have their roots in the interplay between the notion of Gypsies as a separate, often despised race and the psychic or aesthetic desire to dissolve the boundary between English and Gypsy worlds. By the beginning of the twentieth century, she argues, romantic

identification with Gypsies had hardened into caricature—a phenomenon reflected in D. H. Lawrence's *The Virgin and the Gypsy*—and thoroughly obscured the reality of Gypsy life and history.
